"Knights in Shining Armor: The Pavia Tapestries"

7 enormous Renaissance tapestries displayed alongside impressive examples of 16th-century arms and armor commemorate the Battle of Pavia, Holy Roman Emperor Charles V's 1525 victory over French King Francis I during the 16th-century Italian Wars. The hangings required remarkable feats of collaboration between artists and weavers; these are major designs by court artist Bernard van Orley (1487–1541), woven in a distinguished Brussels workshop.

"The Stuart Collection: Triumph of the Landscape"

60 works in varied media chart the rise of native landscape art, especially in England, where artists "discovered" the beauties of Britain while they were constrained from traveling on the continent during the Napoleonic Wars. Sketchbooks and watercolors illustrate the desire to capture the qualities of real places, whose legacies include the triumphs of Impressionism later in the 19th century.





"Tamara de Lempicka"

The first US retrospective exhibition for this artist--90 works of art traversing Lempicka's career from her beginnings in Paris to New York and Los Angeles in the 1940s. Classic portraits, sensual figure studies, and melancholic still lifes trace the influences she absorbed from Cubist aesthetics, fashion and design, and her deep appreciation for art of the Renaissance and the paintings of Ingres; complemented by the MFAH's Art Deco collection of costumes and design.

Art inSight explored the work of Lempicka as a "Great Women Artist" in 2022.
